NOVEMBER 12th & 13th MEETINGS -- DAVID EASTERBROOK

We had a great turnout for David Easterbrook's Lecture/Demo & workshops. Approximately 40 members attended the AM Lecture/Demo & 20 members enrolled in the 2 workshops.

Our business meeting covered Larch payments, the Holiday Party sign-up, tropical tree orders for out June Workshop and a review of the anticipated schedule of our 2007 program.

In keeping with our Larch Program, George LeBolt displayed one of his Larches as our **Tokonoma**.



Then David Easterbrook took us deep into the woods! He started with a forest clump of about 30 trunks & a mass of twigery. Off came the lower branches & out went the superfluous trunks. Many trees were repositioned to improve their spacing & trunk heights were adjusted. Then came the arduous & skillful task of wiring & finally the artistic job of shifting & placing branches. Et voila! An ancient forest appeared, as if by magic. See the pictures.

During this entire process, David fielded all questions & gave us an amazing array of practical knowledge.

The lucky raffle winner was John Bockelman.

Following a short break, the afternoon Workshop had 8 participants. Each of the collected trees & forests supplied was remarkable. In some cases main lines could be pictured. In others, all was concealed within a myriad of convoluted branches & twigs. David studied each tree in turn, presented the owner with a sketch of what to work towards, made some cuts & got them started. Later, after wiring, he adjusted trunk and branch positions. The result: some of the most spectacular trees we ever saw in a Workshop.

The next day (Monday) we had 12 more participants in the Workshop with equally rewarding results.

Great job by David, & we are planning to have him visit with us again in 2009.

From another point of view, here is a Workshop write-up from one of our newer Members, Sherwin Cheng:

"With all of the hype leading up to our highly anticipated Larch workshop, I really didn't know what to expect? Here we were going to have a hands on workshop with the "Michael Jordan" of the Bonsai world.

In my short time with Bonsai and the BBS, I've had two words drilled Into my head. "TAPER" and "MOVEMENT". Unfortunately, none of my current trees have these two things. I do have inverse taper, and straight taper (i.e., zero movement). But I've learned that there is beauty in all that is Bonsai. We just need to find the beauty and make the most out of it. Not every tree will have beautiful nebari, old and flaky bark, perfectly placed branches and ideal symmetry. And that's OK. We all need to start somewhere.

This brings me back to our workshop with David. The day started off with a long styling demonstration with an enormous larch forest. Several hours later, and 90% of the branches on floor, and David had created a magnificent forest, complete with jins and sharis.

Then our workshop started and I was presented with my tree. My tree looked obviously old, and vaguely resembled a scorpion ready to strike. Only 4 in. high, with outstretched branches, the tree could best be described as a semi-cascade. After what seemed like an eternity, David worked his way over to my tree and quickly sketched an artistic rendition of what my tree could be. Then he started chopping! Pretty soon, my tree had only 2 main branches. Then the wiring started and I was certain that I would have every branch wired before David could work his way back to my table. Time started to run short, but David did work his way back to me and within 3 minutes had every branch twisted and shaped similar to his drawing. So what did I learn after spending the day with David and the wonderful members of the BBS?

1) Less is more!!

2) Avoid straight lines!!

I still don't know how to jin or create shari on my tree, but hopefully I'll learn.

So, I would personally like to thank David for collecting our incredible trees and for taking the time to share with all of his us his vast Bonsai knowledge. And once again, thanks to George, our leader supreme, for organizing the event and making all of this possible.
