LAST MONTH'S MEETING — AUG. 15TH — OPEN WORKSHOP — BYOB



July can be a busy bonsai month with heavy work often necessary on tropical trees. However, enough members made it to the July meeting to make it very interesting and informative. The business portion of the meeting which started on time was short. We then began the fun part with a discussion of the **tokonoma** that I brought it. It was a **bougainvillea** with lots of bright red flowers covering it. In each red flower there was a small bright yellow stamen. This is a very old tree with an 8 inch trunk and a 14 inch base. It has been damaged many times in storms and was once split in half by a falling very large maple tree branch that at the same time split a concrete bird bath.

I reviewed a new method of caring for my tropical trees (they are the only ones that I have facilities for) that has caused them to explode in their new southwest location on my small patio with nothing to block the sun until late afternoon. They are wa-

tered as needed (usually 1/day in the summer) with about a ½ dose of the recommendation of a water soluble fertilizer (ie 15/30/15) every time I water. When it rains, the excess fertilizer is washed out since I use a very well draining soil. Once a month in the warm weather I also add some fish emulsion along with some soluble kelp. I slowly decrease the amounts so that by winter, the dosage is down to about an 1/8th of the normal dose. I also mist the trees as often as possible with a pinch of fertilizer in the misting water (sometimes 3-4 times a day in the summer). The only "drawback" is that I have to pinch and prune a lot more often than I ever did because this method seems to allow them to grow rapidly but the pruning and pinching results in lots of ramification and allows me to control the styling more easily.

I hope that this gives you something to think about and by adopting some of these methods, helps your trees.

The meeting was very helpful to those who brought trees that needed some input regarding styling and cutting. Each tree received many opinions because each plant contained a variety of possible bonsai that could be evolved depending upon the owners liking. I think that those who brought in trees were very pleased with the results. Some wanted to think about it but others selected a style that they liked best and began working on their tree immediately. If there was a problem along the way, there were several members available to help. Thanks to all the advanced members willing to give their time to help others.

David Eaterbrook has been one of Bergen Bonsai Societies favorites for years. He was with us in April of 2009 and gave us one of that year's most memorable demos. Who can forget the fabulous weeping willow he styled. This year he will be with us again on September 20th, working on a Scotts Pine in a literati style. This again will be a Bergen Bonsai's event not to be missed.

David comes to us from Montreal where he has been curator of the Montreal Botanical Garden's bonsai collection since 1982. Among the most prestigious collections in North America, it includes 30 masterpiece bonsai donated by the Nippon Bonsai Association, 40 dwarf potted trees from the collection of Hong Kong banker Dr. Wu Yee-Sun, over 300 **penjing** donated by the People's Republic of China, new specimens of Vietnamese bonsai and a North American bonsai collection featuring outstanding mature bonsai created by North American experts including our own George LeBolt.

David began growing bonsai in 1970 and is owner of a bonsai nursery. He studied bonsai in Japan in 1981 and teaches regular bonsai classes as well as being a well-known lecturer and demonstrator in northeastern US and Canada and also France. He served as president of the Montreal Bonsai Society in 1982 and 1983 and was chairman of the American Bonsai Society convention which was held in Montreal in July 1988. He has also authored two books on bonsai and bonsai care and techniques.

This is one meeting you don't want to miss. Come early because we will start on time, we don't want to waste a minute of our time with David.
