## <u>LAST MONTH'S MEETING — SEPT. 19TH — GUEST ARTIST MARTY-SCHMALENBERG (BYOB WORKSHOP)</u>

The excitement, enthusiasm, and emotion that Marty Schmalenberg conveyed to our members was contagious. For me, Marty was certainly among the most, if not the most exciting and interesting guest artist that we have had at our club since I have been a member.

Marty started with a series of some 30 fascinating slides, with a detailed discussion of each. With his experience as a teacher, Asian history expert, bonsai artist with studies in Japan and China, and multiple other talents, he conveyed to us the background of the origins of Asian art, poetry, and bonsai. Sounds boring? NO WAY coming from Marty.

Back in the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> centuries, Chinese scholars, teachers, and intellects would gather in facilities constructed especially to stimulate creativity in art and poetry (like the Chinese garden on Staten Island that we visited). The goal was to put on canvas and into words, feelings and emotions that the individual was sensing based on visions and memories in their lives. There was an outcropping of art and poetry never before seen. In this art form, one can sense the beginnings of a appreciation for nature and the landscape around them, presented in a way that conveyed their reaction and emotions to what they were seeing, hearing, and above all feeling.

One of the first bonsai art forms was bunjin (China) or literati (Japan). Marty is an artist and this style has a special appeal for him. He reviewed the whys and wherefores of this type of design. "Does the tree go from left to right or right to left" was a fun question that he posed to us often. "Feel the design and let the eye tell you where the tree is going".

The large yamadori pine tree that he converted into a exciting bonsai with some help from Peter, Len, and myself doing some wiring and jining ended up as a wonderful piece of material with tremendous potential. The raffles sold very well. Most of us wanted to win this piece of nature but only one winner was possible and that was Jeanne Yu. Lucky lady!!! You have a marvelous piece of material to develop into a extraordinary bonsai.



The workshop that followed just emphasized Marty's eye for finding the best bonsai trees within large pieces of material that each participant brought in for decision making. It was truly a "workshop" with everyone choosing a design and working to achieve the beginnings of an end product.

# <u>THIS MONTH'S MEETING —OCT 17TH — GUEST ARTIST — DAVID EASTER-BROOK (MATERIAL SUPPLIED)</u>



David Eaterbrook has been one of Bergen Bonsai Societies favorites for years. He was with us in April of 2009 and gave us one of that year's most memorable demos. Who can forget the fabulous weeping willow he styled. This year he will be with us again on Oct 17th, working on a Scotts Pine in a literati style. This again will be a Bergen Bonsai's event not to be missed.

David comes to us from Montreal where he has been curator of the Montreal Botanical Garden's bonsai collection since 1982. Among the most prestigious collections in North America, it includes 30 masterpiece bonsai donated by the Nippon Bonsai Association, 40 dwarf potted trees from the collection of Hong Kong banker Dr. Wu Yee-Sun, over 300 **penjing** donated by the People's Republic of China, new specimens of Vietnamese bonsai

and a North American bonsai collection featuring outstanding mature bonsai created by North American experts including our own George LeBolt.

David began growing bonsai in 1970 and is owner of a bonsai nursery. He studied bonsai in Japan in 1981 and teaches regular bonsai classes as well as being a well-known lecturer and demonstrator in northeastern US and Canada and also France. He served as president of the Montreal Bonsai Society in 1982 and 1983 and was chairman of the American Bonsai Society convention which was held in Montreal in July 1988. He has also authored two books on bonsai and bonsai care and techniques.

This is one meeting you don't want to miss. Come early because we will start on time, we don't want to waste a minute of our time with David.
