


<u>LAST MONTH'S MEETING — OCTOBER 17TH — GUEST ARTIST —</u> DAVID EASTERBROOK

When David Easterbrook comes to Bergen Bonsai, it is a special treat and the large attendance at the last meeting was a tribute to him. His topic was literati style bonsai and it was doubly interesting having heard about literati from Mary Schralenberg last month.

David started out with a picture presentation of the evolution of literati and the origins of its definition. Again, it is a style that represents the emotions and feelings of the artist at the time of the creation of the bonsai. Rules are important but this is one style that is free flowing with emotion and therefore can be anything as long as it has a relatively long trunk (compared to the diameter) with little taper and is somewhat sparse, indicating that it has aged in a tough survival environment.



A lovely large scots pine was chosen as the demo tree. David took this "lovely" tree and made a wonderful literati that was a stand out. In fact, we raised more money from raffle tickets than we have in a very long time. It was a tree to own. The tickets were mixed up and as Peter, along with others chomped at the bit to win this masterpiece, David chose the winner. For the second time in 10 years, I had the lucky draw.



What a tough break for me. The problem is that I have no facility to house any kind of tree except tropical, at my new home. I was so happy to have Peter offer to swap a tree with me, knowing that these literatic could not have a better home and I promised Peter to take excellent care of the tree that he gives me in exchange. I shall miss this tree but I am sure that Peter will let me visit it on occasion.





The afternoon workshop proceeded with some lovely nursery grown scots pines that David brought down from Canada. David had these trees in training for the past several years specifically to be styled as **literati**. I am certain that the Members who styled their trees with David's input were very satisfied with the result.
