

There was a hanging branch that dropped down about two feet below the level of the pot along with massive growth above the pot. What to do? There were many options.

John was an excellent presenter in that he continued to describe each step of the conversion as he did it and this wild bush slowly evolved into a wonderful cascade. It was so easy when John did it. There were many possible designs that one could have come up with to convert this mass of branches and greenery into a pre-bonsai but the one that John chose and followed to convert this bush into a pre-bonsai was just wonderful with great possibilities for its future. BONSAI CARE FROM YAMA KI BONSAI SOCIETY — MONTH OF MAY

- **1.) Fertilizing** Yes to encourage growth. No, for needled trees where short needles are desired unless design requires new growth. Do not fertilize for one month after repotting. Also, to prepare for defoliation after 3 weeks, if required.
- **2.)** Location Hardy leave it to Full Sun; Tropical & Sub-Tropical give half shade for week, then move to permanent location.
- 3.) Pests & Diseases Watch for aphids on new shoots; borers on flowering and fruit bearing trees.
- **4.) Potting** Best season for Camellia and Azalea.
- **5.)** Watering Watch for dehydration because of wind, avoid over watering of pine where shape is finished and there is an attempt to make short needles.
