<u>LAST MONTH MEETING — SEPT 29TH — GUEST ARTIST FROM JAPAN —</u> <u>M. YAMAJI — PRESENT LECTURE / DEMO</u>

It was a beautiful fall day for a bonsai meeting. A large audience came to see and meet Mr Yamaji, our highlighted artist for September.

The meeting started out with a clinic raft style pine, about four feet tall with an enormous base and heavy trunks. It was interesting to see that one of the trunks had dark green foliage while the others were somewhat paler with some slight browning on a few of the lower branch needles Dean was concerned that his tree had some problems. Dean assured us that he rotates the tree to get even sunlight, so that was not a likely cause. Mr. Yamaji thought that the tree overall looked quite good and that it was suffering from the severe summer heat that we had this year. Dean felt much better and we hope that the diagnosis was accurate.

Mr. Yamaji then tackled a very large based yamadori pondorosa pine with lots of curves. He first removed one of the trunks that lacked movement. He was determined to make a major bend on the main branch. He started by placing a heavy copper wire horizontally along the branch. The branch was then wrapped with pre wetted raffia. The trick was to wrap it as tight as he could to protect the bark. Then came several strands of conventional large copper wire. Next an iron bar was wired to the bottom of the bend. With a lot of strength, Mr. Yamaji started to bend this heavy branch. He moved it in about four stages, each time exerting a significant amount of strength while listening for any sound of complaint from the branch. Since there were none, he then went to the next push. Each time listening for tree complaints.

In the end, the branch was where he wanted it with the sharp bend that he was striving for. The rest of the wiring and shaping came quickly. This masterpiece was won, for the umpteenth time by Dean. Congratulations to Mr. Yamaji for his creation and Dean, the proud owner.

Mr Yamaji spent the afternoon conducting a workshop for the members who had signed up for it.

David Easterbrook has been curator of the Montreal Botanical Garden's bonsai collection since 1982. He has retired from his position last year after 28 long years. David is no stranger to us. David began growing bonsai in 1970 and is owner of a bonsai nursery.
