"Thankfully, in 1997 I realized that if I could raise children, I could care for bonsai. Starting with the early Internet bonsai community, I eventually rejoined Yama Ki and fell head over heels for bonsai.

My serious study began when I discovered a scheduled branch of Colin Lewis' Ho Yoku School of Bonsai. Scheduled for four weekends per year over three years, this was the only serious learning opportunity in the New York area since the passing of Yuji Yoshimura. When I learned that it lost its meeting place, I worked hard with Colin to enroll enough people to form a group. A couple here and a friend there and we reached the quorum we needed; we began our sessions with twelve people meeting in my garage.

Over the course of the three year Ho Yoku school, I learned the fundamentals of bonsai design, care and display. About this time I also began to study and collect bonsai pottery, display objects and to fall in love with viewing stones and particularly the Japanese suiseki aesthetic.

In the spring of 2004, friend and fellow Ho Yoku classmate Todd Hansen convinced me to enter the American Bonsai Society's Joshua Roth New Talent Competition. Competing against eight other contestants, my tree was chosen by the bonsai masters headlining the 2004 BCI/ABS convention. This was an amazing moment for me and propelled me to continue my bonsai education with gusto." Mike Pollock

BONSAI CARE FROM YAMA KI BONSAI SOCIETY — MONTH —JANUARY

For Hardy Plants—They should all be in the protected location. Cold frame or pit closed tightly, after enough water, insecticide, and fungicide have been applied.

For Tropical and Sub - Tropical

- 1.) Fertilizing No to Hardy; Yes to Tropical
- 2.) Location—Prepare winter location; Bring Tropical indoors.
- 3.) Pests & Diseases Dormant spray for Hardy; Spray as required for Tropical.
- 4.) Potting Tropical Only.
- 5.) Pruning Hardy no drastic pruning; Tropical as required.
- 6.) Watering Check outdoor plants and cold frame; Extra water and humidity for Tropical
