LAST MEETINGS —OCT 11TH AND 12TH — DAVID EASTERBROOD



David Easterbrook's weekend visit to our club, Oct 11 and 12, was one of the high points of Bergen Bonsai's program for the year. For those of us who participated it was a chance to experience and work with a really skilled artist and teacher. Seven of us participated in the Saturday open workshop, which was intended for all skill levels. Most of us had more than one tree to work on, with trees ranging from six or seven inches high to a large five foot pitch pine. Some of the trees were second timers having initially been worked on by David at last years' Japanese maple workshop. Others were unfinished or semi finished problem trees whose owners didn't know how to improve further. Two of the trees were very healthy long established and styled bonsai, and two were relatively recently collected and in need of initial styling.

After doing over 5000 trees (his estimate) David found ways of making all of these trees come closer to achieving their bonsai potential. He often drew a picture of what that tree could become as a guide to its further development before helping or actually doing some of the work. Surprises occurred all the time. I personally had been wedded to what I thought was the best front for my big pitch pine and when David suggested turning it around so that the back became the

front, I was resistant, even though he could explain the advantages to doing so. It can be very hard to see the strongest potential bonsai in an undeveloped tree and most choices cannot be undone so it's good to have a trusted, supportive, experienced and knowledgeable teacher. David tuned his interventions to the level of experience for each participant. In addition to design, David is very knowledgeable about horticulture and the mechanics of keeping bonsai growing and healthy. We worked all day from 10 am to about 5pm; well worth the \$50 cost.

The Sunday morning lecture/demo was attended by about 25 people. The primary focus was on privets as bonsai. They make excellent trees which can be green housed for year round growth or garaged kept for winter. There was a lot of other information: how shohins are made; making your own soil; Al versus Cu wire; how to develop taper in new trees and loads of other tips that we may or may not already know but were explained again with clarity. This was all done while David was styling one of the eight specially grown privets which he brought with him. Congratulations to David Feitelson on winning the tree. The Sunday afternoon workshop was attended by 6 participants styling additional privets supplied by Easterbrook. These were about 1.5 inches at their base and all had taper with nice lines and good branching. These were excellent starting level bonsai and each of us came away with a fine tree to develop for years to come.

Annealed Copper Wire Order

The Bergen Bonsai Society will be making a club order of annealed copper wire coils. Copper wire suitable for bonsai work is annealed (heated and then cooled slowly). When this wire is wound around a branch, it work hardens, and a branch wrapped in this wire will retain a bent shape. To be effective the wire should be wound around the branch at an angle of 45 degrees and as a general guideline its thickness should be at least 1/3 the diameter of the branch which is being bent. The diameter of the wire is specified by its number, with #22 being the thinnest and suitable for the smallest branches and fine detail work. The sizes used most often are # 10 through #16.
