LAST MEETING —MAY 3rd — GUEST ARTIST — OWEN REICH —LECT/DEMO

Those of us who attended the last bonsai meeting had a rare treat listening to Owen Reich, an artist who was more concerned about the trees that he works on rather than a quick demonstration that ends in a "finished" tree. The goal was not to harm the tree. He presented options for the future and was totally consumed by his not damaging a single branch in his conversion of the tree to a bonsai.

Even better, Owen was a teacher as well as an artist. He knew the details of what a tree species needs to survive, not for a year but for years. He suggested that beginners should specialize in a few species and really get to know them and their needs before branching out to other ones. That is how you keep a tree alive - through knowledge of what it wants and what it needs and this takes time, patience, and learning.

We cannot have our trees looking like finished bonsai all the time, if they are to survive. We must give the tree time to grow and renew its energy, then shape it, then let it grow, and then shape it, and let it grow, etc. In Japan, growers let trees develop in cycles over years to achieve the optimum design and maximum health.

The workshop was very interesting when this same philosophy of Owen's was applied. Peter found a magnificent juniper in PA a few months ago which he brought in. Owen took one look at it and we all had to swoon with what he said. This rare tree must have passed through many owners because it was very old and very unique. It would be an honor for an expert to work on it and that sent Peter to thinking of his responsibility as to what to do with it. To be continued.

The other trees that members had brought in received the same care and advise from Owen in what turned out to be a fine teaching environment.

We should have Owen back again to visit our club. - Mitch
